Sacred Heart College has attained yet another milestone by establishing a centre that is dedicated to skill development courses under the ageis of Don Bosco Centre for Skill Development (DBCSD). It is a new venture initiated in the academic year 2023 – 2024. This one-of-a-kind initiative was inaugurated on 14th July 2023 by our Principal Rev. Dr. Maria Antony Raj, SDB. A total of 2624 students of which 1994 are UG and 630 are PG students from both the Shifts actively registered for various courses.

Out of the 2624 registered students, 2483 students have successfully completed their courses during the odd semester of the academic year 2023 – 2024.

Institution Research Day is a day organised to recognise and reward the faculty members who have published papers, chapters and books every year. In a commitment to fostering a culture of research excellence, our college has instituted a commendable initiative by providing incentives for faculty members who publish scholarly papers. In the heart of Tirupattur Town, the Sacred Heart College Extension Centre stands as a beacon of hope and empowerment since its establishment in 1973. As a legally registered Non-Governmental Organization, its commitment to sustainable development strategies for the youth and the impoverished has been unwavering. This report sheds light on the myriad initiatives undertaken by the Department of Extension Education and Services, showcasing the society's dedication to fostering positive change in the community.

# Women's Empowerment

The Sacred Heart College Society's initiative for women's empowerment is centered around fostering a sense of unity and support among women. In collaboration with the Indian Bank, Nationalized Banks, and NABFINS, have empowered **20,332 women**, fostering entrepreneurship in diverse sectors such as coir production, millet processing, and cleaning supplies. Notably, the Women Empowerment Loan programme has disbursed a total amount of **Rs. 15,24,70,000 across 217 groups** from April 2023 to December 2023 with the help of NABFINS, Indian Bank, Bank of Baroda, Union Bank of India, Cooperative Bank, supporting various economic endeavours and fostering financial independence among women.

### Women Skill Training Programme

The Sacred Heart College Society has been proactive in women's skill development, offering Aari Work and Tailoring classes. 112 students mastered various Aari embroidery techniques under dedicated guidance and the Tailoring class benefitted 110 candidates. Additionally, an awareness programme was conducted to educate the students about women's issues and welfare schemes available to them.

# Skill Training for Underprivileged Youth

# MSME Entrepreneurship Training for Scheduled Tribe and Scheduled Caste SHG Members

The MSME Development and Facilitation Office in Chennai conducted a ground breaking Entrepreneurship Awareness Programme on November 23, 2023, benefiting 110 Scheduled Tribe women from SHGs in Tirupattur. The programme covered DIC Subsidy Schemes, TAHDCO Support Schemes, Banking Support, Handholding, MSME Schemes, and SEEDS Trust, offering comprehensive insights for aspiring entrepreneurs. Additionally, the Six Weeks Entrepreneurship Development Programme held from December 8, 2023, to January 23, 2024, provided a holistic learning experience, bringing together key stakeholders and experts to inspire and empower ST & SC entrepreneurs in Tirupattur. After the Six weeks of Training programme Extension Service will receive Rs.1,25,000 from MSME Chennai.

# National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development (NABARD)

Guided by the adept leadership of Director and Vice-Principal (Shift-II) Rev. Dr. D. Shanmugam, the Department of Extension Education and Services (DEEDS) at Sacred Heart College, Tirupattur, joined hands with NABARD for a One-Day Training Programme on January 4, 2024. Approximately **10 NGO Field Workers** attended the session, focusing on essential skills and roles. The training covered key topics, including SHG/JLG lending, essential skills for field workers, women's protection, child rights, and the current status of NGOs in promoting SHGs.

## **TAHDCO Tractor Survey**

TAHDCO funded a survey to evaluate the successful distribution of loans in economic development programmes. Social Work students conducted a comprehensive study across **2 districts (Dharmapuri and Tiruvallur)**, specifically focusing on individuals who accessed tractors through the TADCO entrepreneurship programme in 2021-2022 and 2022-2023. The grant received for this survey is **Rs. 1,91,350/-** is aimed at assessing the economic status of the programme beneficiaries.

# **Family Counselling Centre**

The Family Counselling Centre by the Don Bosco Institute seves approximately **450 families** annually. Recently recognized as a State Service Provider by the Tamil Nadu State Government, the centre, evaluated by TISS, received the highest rank among all centres in the state. With a focus on family well-being, the centre addresses issues like separation, marital problems, alcoholism, and economic challenges, catering to diverse needs with qualified counsellors.

### **Evening Study Centre**

The 10 evening study centres managed by the Sacred Heart College Society in slum settlements significantly contribute to boosting pass percentages, especially in 10th-std government examinations. These centres play a crucial role in preventing dropouts by providing individual attention and addressing community-specific challenges for **262 benefiting students**. A heart-warming Christmas Celebration was organized on 17th December, 2023 at the DEEDS Evening Study Centre in Tirupattur.

# Scholarships for Gypsy Students who are pursuing Higher Education

Sacred Heart College, with DBSARC and SURABI, organized a Scholarship Distribution on August 17, 2023. Led by the Department of Extension Education and Services, it granted **Rs.3,25,000/-** in cheques to 21 deserving students from marginalized communities (Gypsy). Rev. Fr. Leo (SURABI) and Rev. Fr. Christopher (DBSARC) and Rev.Dr.Samson

Shanmugam were central to the programme, empowering students through vital financial aid for education.

## **Empowerment of Gypsy Community**

The Gypsy Development Programme by the Department of Extension Education and Services supports **45 families in Idhaya Nagar**, emphasizing education. It enrolled **41 students from schools, and 9 from college**, and facilitated community certificates to **70 applicants**. A study centre aids **45 students**, and financial assistance, including ISR loans, was provided, with three recipients receiving **3,00,000 and one receiving 1,00,000**. The programme also organized meetings, granting **Rs. 15,000 scholarships** to each candidate for initiatives like the Brave Project and the Surabi Scholarship.

## • Loan Disbursement to Gypsies

To uplift **4 Gypsy families**, a significant initiative granted each family a **Rs. 4,00,000 loan.** This financial support aims at promoting economic empowerment, improving overall well-being, addressing unique challenges in the Gypsy communities, fostering inclusivity, and creating opportunities for socio-economic advancement.

# Livestock Grant to Gypsies

On September 14, 2023, Sacred Heart College, in collaboration with SURABI and DBSARC, distributed a Livestock Support Grant of **Rs. 90,000 to nine Gypsy women in Idaya Nagar, Pachal Village**. Led by Rev. Dr. Praveen Peter and Rev. Dr. Maria Antony Raj, each beneficiary received **Rs. 10,000 to initiate their enterprises**, marking a meaningful step towards economic empowerment for these women.

### Workshop on Menstrual Hygiene for Gypsy Women

Workshop was organised at DB Centre covering menstrual hygiene, sexual and reproductive health, gender equality, and prevention of reproductive tract infections for Gypsy women. The Guest of Honour, Mr.

Arul Doss, along with Mr. Moses and the DBSARC team, participated. Sessions by Mrs. Sandhiya and Ms. Anthonyammal from Sacred Heart College provided insightful talks, specifically addressing the sexual and reproductive health needs of Gypsy, Irular, and Thurumbar community women.

## Unnat Bharat Abhiyan (UBA)

Sacred Heart College Society, in collaboration with **Unnat Bharat Abhiyan** (**UBA**), conducted awareness meetings in Mookanur and A.K. Mottur Villages to empower rural communities. In Mookanur, a session focused on schemes for below-poverty-line individuals, covering housing programmes, free sewing machines, and the One Stop Centre for counselling and medical aid. In A.K. Mottur, a meeting emphasized skill training and entrepreneurship for women, featuring an awareness talk by Mr. Arul Doss. These initiatives aim to enhance the quality of life in rural areas.

# Creche for underprivileged Children at Sivarajpettai and Sagayanagar

Since 1986, the Sacred Heart College Society has operated two crèche centres in Sivarajpet and Sagaya Nagar, funded by the Central Social Welfare Board. Catering to over **80 underprivileged children** annually, these centres provide nutritious meals, emergency medications, and educational resources. The programme has benefited a **total of 688 children**, ensuring their well-being and early childhood development.
