Guidelines for student projects (Sacred Heart Fellowship)

- 1. Only first year PG students are eligible to apply in the prescribed format (enclosed)
- 2. Only one project proposal can be submitted by a student or by a group of students (team). A student/team must send ONLY ONE proposal and they SHOULD NOT change the topic and must not deviate from the objectives of the sanctioned project proposal.
- 3. The project proposed should be original, innovative and novel. It should be implementable.
- 4. The Project Guide needs to evaluate the project proposals and scrutinize them before submitting the project proposals.
- 5. Two copies of the project proposals (in the prescribed format, soft bind) complete in all respects should be submitted to the Dean of Research office on or before 18 March 2024. Those project proposals which are not in the prescribed format will be rejected.
- 6. Shortlisting of proposals will be done by the committee appointed by the Principal. Shortlisted students will be intimated and they will be asked to give a presentation to the expert committee appointed by the Principal
- 7. Expert committee will recommend the eligible candidates for fellowships to the Principal for their approval.
- 8. Sanction letters will be issued (with the terms and conditions) and subsequently sanctioned projects will be given 100% of the total project cost.
- 9. The project will commence immediately upon receipt of the sanction letter.
- 10. The sanctioned amount should only be used by the student for buying chemicals, for characterization studies, field visit for data collection and survey. This money can also be used by the student towards registration fees for attending conferences, travel and other project related expenses.
- 11. The Guide/student must ensure that atleast one research paper is published in Scopus/WoS/UGC-CARE journal. Proper acknowledgement of the SH Fellowship (quoting the award letter No.) must be mentioned in the research paper.
- 12. Internal auditing must be done and the auditing statement duly signed by the project guide and the student must be submitted to the Dean of Research in the prescribed format along with the project report, failing which the sanctioned money should be returned.
