CASE STUDY 1 : OUTREACH

Activity	Impact
CASE STUDY 1: OUTREACH ACTIVITIES	
a) Community Integration	By actively engaging in outreach activities, students at SHC become an integral part of the local community. This firsthand experience exposes them to the real challenges faced by the community, fostering a deeper understanding of social issues.
b) Empathy and Social Responsibility	The direct participation of every second-year undergraduate student emphasizes the cultivation of empathy and a sense of social responsibility. Students learn to apply their academic knowledge to contribute positively to society.
c) Application of Knowledge	Through planned activities that benefit neighboring villages, students apply their academic knowledge in practical, community-oriented contexts, reinforcing the relevance of education in addressing societal issues.

CASE STUDY 2: SHARING IS CARING – “SHARING DAY”	
a) Values of Generosity	Organizing Sharing Day and contributing to disaster relief efforts instill values of generosity and compassion among students. They learn the importance of sharing resources with those less fortunate, contributing to a more compassionate and empathetic society.
b) Global Citizenship	Substantial contributions to disaster relief efforts, especially during the pandemic, exemplify a sense of global citizenship. Students recognize the interconnectedness of communities and the importance of supporting others beyond immediate local needs.
c) Personal Growth	Engaging in charitable activities promotes personal growth by encouraging students to step outside their comfort zones, fostering a mindset of giving back to society.

CASE STUDY 3: INSTITUTIONAL SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY	
a) Transformation: Gypsy Community	The adoption of the Gypsy Community and the construction of a community hall at SHC showcase a strong commitment to Institutional Social Responsibility (ISR). Now, all 52 children from the Gypsy community are attending schools, and some have even pursued higher studies at SHC. ISR has ensured that no child in this community is left without education. The community hall also functions as an evening tuition centre, illustrating the powerful impact of education and community development. Students witness the transformative power of education and community development, encouraging them to actively participate in similar initiatives.
b) Skill Development	The focus on skill and training programmes, supported by external funding, highlights the importance of holistic development. Students understand the role of education and skills in empowering marginalized communities, promoting a broader perspective on social issues.
c) Environmental Stewardship	Recognition with the Green-Champion Award and the Palmyra tree planting project instill a sense of environmental stewardship. Students learn about the interconnectedness of social and environmental issues, fostering a commitment to sustainable practices.
