With respect to extra-curricular activities the students of the department did a commendable job.

The one aspect that has been found worrying is about the drop outs. The committee also found the statement made by the department with respect to the entrylevel behavior of the students who are coming from Tamil Medium as convincing.

The interactions held with both UG and PG students revealed their current performance levels and future expectations. The committee received a few worthy suggestions and request from the students which are given at the end. The discussions held with the M.Phil. students helped the committee to come to the conclusion that they are highly motivated and given the right amount of guidance and help they will come up.
